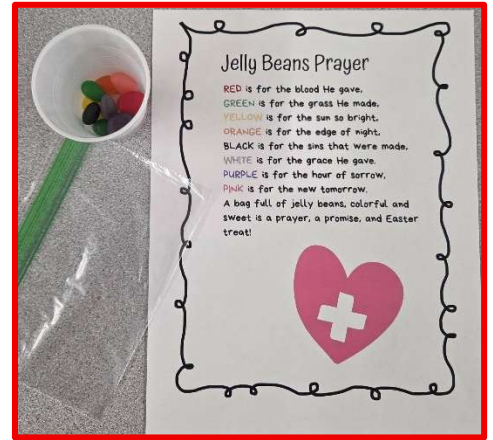
1ST GRADE

4th grade is enjoying a morning of painting crosses and shopping the class store - spoiler most of them chose to continue saving their money to get the bigger ticket items!

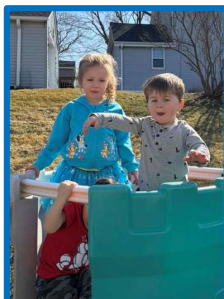
