2ND GRADE

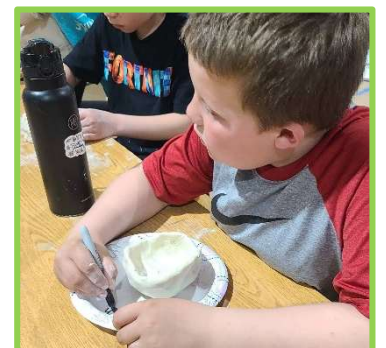


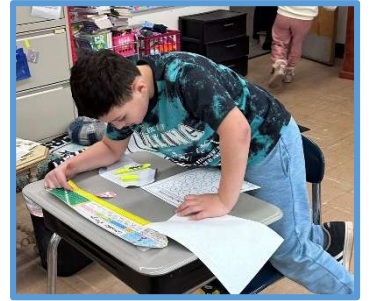
