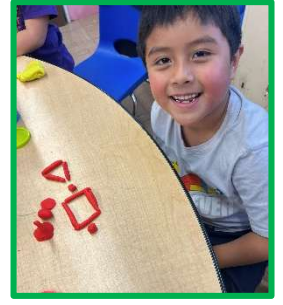

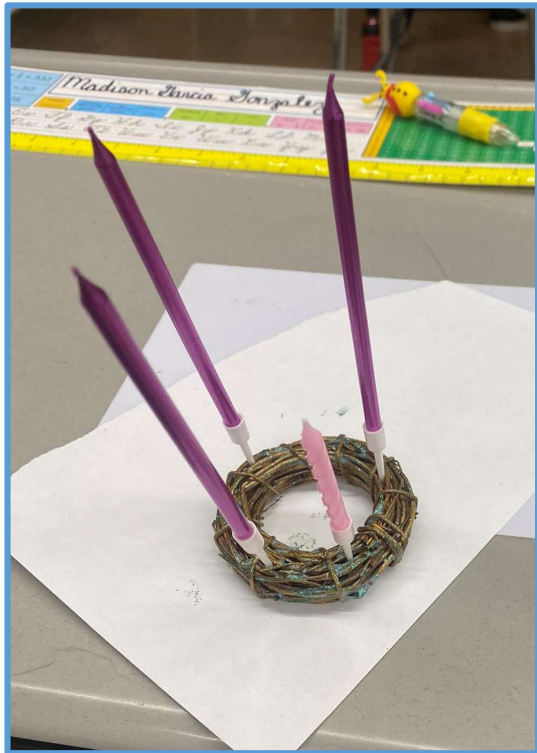


2ND GRADE
