













Mrs. Fehring's mother-in-law passed away and with a generous donation in her memory, she was able to purchase books for a book study in our 3rd grade reading class.














The 1st graders shared their experiences after caring for their pet peeps for a week. It was fun to see their excitement about this project!



ST. MARY SCHOOL EXPANSION MEETING



Tuesday, April 29th

6:00 pm at St. Mary, Lomira Lower level of the school (Enter through lower level doors in the back)







In 2nd grade, we made "tomb snacks." We learned about the Stations of the Cross and then discussed how each part of our snack represented a different aspect of Jesus's resurrection.

The crescent roll represented the cloths Jesus was wrapped in. The marshmallow or Peep represented Jesus Himself. The butter symbolized the embalming oil used on Jesus, and the sugar on the Peep represented the spices used to anoint Him. The oven symbolized the tomb where Jesus was placed.

Once the snacks were done baking, we cut them open to find that the Peep had disappeared—just like Jesus was no longer in the tomb when the stone was rolled away.
